



Anne Crahay studied graphic design at ESA Saint-Luc Liège (Belgium). She then worked in animated films and graphics studios before teaching drawing and illustration at Saint-Luc.

The belgian author-illustrator, who has published is a finalist of the 2010 and 2022 Bologna Children's book fair's Illustration Awards.

Anne Crahay's potato-shaped and poetic collages in *Le sourire de Suzie (Suzie's Smile)*

"Collage opens up a calmer space for research; the little papers invade the work tables, they attract each other, come together, and I become a spectator of the emerging images."

Recycled papers, painted or sketched rhodoid, lightly colored or hollowed tracing paper, partially glued fabrics and lace... Materials used for collage and the techniques to enhance and assemble them give Anne Crahay's illustrations a palimpsest effect, enabling several image readings. This little Suzie with the intriguing potato-shaped face hides her game well: indeed, she questions us about the injunction given to children to smile – out of politeness, to be cute, or simply to reassure the adults.

In Suzie's smile, Anne Crahay did not seek "le beau, mais le juste" – i.e. not to create beautiful images per se but to find the right balance. The backgrounds of the illustrations are structured using hatching on the rice paper or pieces of asymmetrically cut rhodoid. The elements are placed, barely glued, to preserve the volume of the composition. Naughty wind, dark clouds and threatening waves made of tracing paper painted or marked with a felt-tip pen are all metaphors spun to describe how the little girl is overwhelmed by emotions, which leave the adults distraught.





















The original drawings are surprisingly light despite the thicknesses, notably certain rigid materials or the tape delicately placed here and there. Diaphanous rice paper summons fragility, the ephemeral, the precious. Suzie is a little human being that we want to protect, take in our arms and reassure like her parents do at the end of the book:

After the flood, we were all wet. It was funny. Especially dad.

Mom said softly:

"I love you when you are happy, and I love you when you are sad."

Dad said quietly:

"You are our Suzie for life!"

Unsurprisingly, the five illustrations from which this book was created received a special mention at the Bologna Children's Book Fair in 2010.

What sparked the desire to write this book?

Toddlers fascinate me. Their intelligence, curiosity, presence and intensity are constant sources of wonder. I read somewhere that it's not because a baby does not speak that he or she does not have anything to say. And then, I discovered the work of the Belgian *Bébé Signe* network, and this illustrated book became evident.

Did you work differently from your other books? You took part in collective parent-baby workshops... and I believe that, despite its simple appearance, this book required a lot of "technical" adjustments, no?

I met the Babibar team in Liège (Belgium) to prepare this project. The association hosts Bébé Signe modules: the opportunity to follow an initiation and to attend the dance of the little fingers presented itself to me. Observe the complicity, the joy, the intensity of the looks and the incredible intelligence of the very young child... suspended moments...

When the images were under construction, it was necessary to test the correct understanding of the signs and the ability of readers to reproduce them quickly without specific training.

I adjusted, changed angles, moved thumbs, and re-drew each hand numerous times to make the illustration communicate the gesture correctly, i.e., as simply and precisely as possible. In this regard, I am grateful to the teachers, volunteer readers and librarians who shared their valuable comments with me.

1 • Shhh!

2 • Good morning!

The index finger is placed in front of the mouth.







Once the illustrations were finished, we decided not to scan but photograph the images to take full advantage of the collage technique. Attentive readers will perceive the different thicknesses of the coloured papers and the light shadows, which give volume and warmth to the composition. Relatively demanding lighting and photoengraving work...

How did the text come to you?

I first identified a baby's needs: drinking, eating, peeing, playing, etc. It also seemed essential to me to add the verb "to dream" to this list. Essential that this word exists very, very early in a human's life.

Then, the text came out loud like a song. I often do this because the album has a fundamental spoken dimension. The baby follows the music of the words, settles into the repetition of the nursery rhyme and savours the intonations, the silences and the fantasy of the narration.

The hand is one of the most complex parts of the body to represent; how did you approach its drawing?

I took pictures of my daughter's hands and completed my research in educational publications. Then, I drew, redrew, and refined my drawings little by little, sometimes deviating from the photographic reference to better understand the position.

The desire to work on this hand in cut-out paper and flat black, as in "puppet theatre", forced me to constantly rework the lines of my drawing. At the end of the process, we have a relatively sober and realistic sign, which contrasts with the treatment of the caterpillar.

This little caterpillar is a real clown! What does it bring to the story?

I didn't want to offer another tool or instructional book to learn how to sign with your baby. I wanted a real story with a character, things to observe, and surprises.

The caterpillar is an accumulation of round shapes. We stack them, and the caterpillar goes up! We make them explode in the four corners of the page, and the caterpillar falls! We roll them up, and the caterpillar is sleeping! The possibilities are endless, and I marvel at being able to say so much with so little.


Furthermore, beyond the graphic pleasure, the caterpillar, baby's alter ego, is obviously the mirror of his/her transformation: from sign to word, from baby to child, from a child's start in life to his/her take-off.





First, a collector of snake skins, beetle moults and other slight traces of life, Marie Saille was a teacher for a few years.

The artist-photographer wants to invite children to question the world around us by looking differently at things and people. Nature is thus her source of inspiration: after exploring the notions of landscape representation, she is moving more and more towards observing small details, experimenting with materials, and the beauty of shapes.
